Stampriet had a good season that ended March and breaking down of previous orchards and soil preparation for, the new season, has already started. We will plant Tomatoes and Peppers later this year.

On 13 April the Sonop office personnel visited the vegetables Fields. All the new and old faces were very exited to see what is happening outside in the fields. Once again it was an incredible experience to see how amazing mother nature grows and develop in different stages.

The farm visit to the different managers were very informative. We started at Kieta's new plantings where **Stoffel Briers** told us about the crucial importance of maintaining healthy soil and how

important correct irrigation practices are to preserve and protect the environment and soil.

The 2# stop was the Nethouses at Oranje Vallei where Willie vd Heever showed us the Pepper plantings

and all the stages of the different orchards that were planted on different dates. Amazing to see the growth in just 2 or 3 weeks time.

Fun fact: 16 000 to 20 000 Pepper seedlings are planted per Hectare on Sonop.



We also visited the weather station at the butternut's orchard. This was very informative to learn that they collect all the weather data and then use this technology in their discission making to best manage water needs.



**Zjacques v Niekerk** showed us the Sontomini tomatoes, while he was explaining the bunches and layers we were all "sampling" the fresh, crunchy, beautiful cocktail tomatoes ③ .. And they were yummy!!
