## **NEWS @ SONOP**

We are at the start of a New Year full of hope and anticipation for the new season in our lives with a new planting season on both tomato and butternut. Butternuts have already been planted at Makalane, Oranje Vallei and Modderdrift and tomatoes at Ramansdrift and Kieta.

Even with the high temperatures we experienced during the butternut planting season late December, the farming teams worked tirelessly, managing the irrigation timing with precision. Their dedication bore fruit, quite literally, as the first shoots were already visible on the first day of January. The beautiful blooming flowers followed shortly thereafter and the butternut growth shows a healthy crop while the teams estimated a promising harvest starting the first week of April. Our strategy is again to export and with the harvest starting earlier than the previous year, we plan to increase the quantity of containers to our loyal export customers.

With the lessons learned from previous seasons, the farmers devised a strategic plan to expand their export reach. The butternut harvest, expected earlier than the previous year, prompted them to increase the quantity of containers for export.

In the quiet moments between tending to the crops, the team paused to offer prayers to their Heavenly Father. Gratitude flowed from their hearts for the blessings bestowed upon them in the previous season and guidance for the one unfolding.

Reflecting on the grape season that concluded just before the New Year, the Sonop team were filled with thankfulness. A staggering 325 000 cartons of grapes were meticulously packed for the export market. The year 2023 marked a significant milestone as the farmers explored new avenues for export. Some of the grape containers made their way through the Namibia Walvis Bay Harbor, a recent upgrade that opened doors for fresh produce suppliers.

The journey through Namibian logistics had its challenges, but the farmers believed in the potential of this new venture. Despite the hurdles, it was a good year and the quality of the grapes delivered to customers spoke volumes about the commitment to the core values of **Quality**, **Integrity and Excellence**.

In the heart of the farming community in Noordoewer and Aussenkehr, where the land meets the sky, Sonop Farms stood as a testament to the delicate dance between nature, hard work, and divine grace. They understood the urgency of the situation and immediately devised plans to hand-water the crops using water carts and black pipes. In those scorching days, the team's dedication to save the plants was unwavering.

Realizing that they needed external support, another part of the team embarked on a journey to Cape Town overnight. Their mission was to collect generators from rental companies, a lifeline to revive the vital pumps that would bring water to the parched fields. By the fourth day, the generators hummed with life, and the team could once again provide the necessary care to the crops.

In the face of the plants rising again from their dire circumstances, gratitude bloomed. The farmers at Sonop were thankful for each member of the team, individuals who didn't think twice to help, who jumped in and gave their best when the land cried out for assistance.

Through it all, the team held onto their gratitude for the privilege of farming. The ability to make plans, the opportunity to experience grace during adversities – these were seen as gifts beyond measure. The recent trials served as poignant reminders of the value of technology and a renewed appreciation for the simple, yet essential, things in life – like the flow of water when opening a tap.

The partnership with nature and the Creator continued, and every day in the fields remained the greatest privilege, a dance of gratitude, hard work, and the ever-present grace of the Almighty.




## **INTERRESTING FACTS ABOUT THE SONOP TEAM**

# VALENTINES DAY @ SONOP FARMS OFFICE 14 FEBRUARY 2024










